

Spring Tips

Treat Your Trees With Care

Spring is a good time to check your trees for signs of severe frost damage, especially if you experienced a cold, harsh winter. Easily accessible damaged branches can be pruned out.

If you are unsure about what needs to be done and if pruning safety is a concern, contacting your landscape professional is a great way to make sure your trees remain in top shape.

- Examine trees for any signs or symptoms of unusual pest activity or potential disease problems.

- Check mulching material to make sure the trees are well covered to conserve moisture and suppress weed growth. The correct amount of mulch is 3-4" at most.
- To promote good leaf and shoot development, make sure to adequately water trees.
- Avoid using herbicides underneath the canopies of trees, especially if they aren't labeled for such use. Certain herbicides can damage trees.
